1. Presidential Address

The president, Khamtanh began his opening speech by welcoming all members and guest players to the first annual meeting of Airsoft Auckland (ASA) Inc. The speech was short and straight to the point.

ASA started in April 2007 as a rag tag bunch of several misfits keen on the sport of airsoft with the vision of growing the club. Through promotional events and word of mouth via enthusiastic members the club has grown rapidly. On 10 September 2007 ASA was officially registered with the ministry of economic development as an incorporated club. By the end of the first year there were 61 members and numerous guests.

The president thanked the committee for all their hard work and the members who have also help and have attended games. Overall it has been a good first year.

2. Financial Accounts Status – Andrew

At the meeting the financial accounts were made presented to all members. Over the last year the club has received \$581 in donations. (For further information see the club account)

Following presentation of the financial accounts a vote was held asking if there was a need for the accounts to be independently audited. All attending the meeting unanimously voted that an independent audit of the financial accounts was not required.

At the AGM, Mark gave an overview of ASNZ as most members were unaware of this group. The society had made significant progress working with the New Zealand Police and customs in order to securer access to semi-automatic airsoft guns.

A vote was held and all members present unanimously agreed that ASA Inc is to join ASNZ.
